Peter Francis Callaghan (1933-2000) Born in Crosby, attended SS Peter and Paul School, National Service in RAF, worked in retail furniture business before mature entry to Simms. Played rugby and was V.P. of Student Union. Taught at St. George's Crosby, Deacon and Trustee of SS Peter and Paul Crosby. His wife Sheila, children Paul, Julie, John, Sheila (son Michael pre-deceased him), live in Crosby. Brother of former Simms Staff Member John Callaghan (P.E.), who still works at USC in Los Angeles.



Michael Christopher Costello (1946-2004) Born in London, after Simms he emigrated to S. Ontario Canada and was teacher, Vice Principal, Principal and Program Coordinator at various schools in the Province. After retirement he was Adjunct Professor for student teachers at Canisius College, Buffalo, New York, USA. His wife Amy, children Amy and Sarah, and three grandchildren live in S. Ontario.



Brian Culligan (1945-2003) aka "Panther", born in Bootle, attended St. Mary's RC College, Crosby. Played 1st team soccer in College, and was an all rounder noted for his dry wit and friendliness. He taught briefly in the UK and Jamaica before moving to the California, where he married Jeanette Najim, ran a taxi service, then became a house parent to his two children. Coached High School soccer with teams four times State finalists. His wife Jeanette still lives in San Francisco, along with son Sean (Lawyer) and Brigit (Sales Exec.) and two grandsons.



Paul Anthony Davidson (1946-2005) aka "Davo", born in Macclesfield, attended Xaverian College RCGS, Manchester. Excelled as goalkeeper, schoolboy trial at Leeds United FC with Don Revie, but lack of height prevented professional career. First choice GK at College, awarded football 'colours' and distinguished gymnast and cricketer. Brave to a fault, suffered ill-health after intervention in an armed bank raid. Survived by his wife Marilyn, children, Sara, and Daniel, and grandchildren, Madelaine, Aengus, Cullen and Genieveve, with the two boys following in Davo's sporting footsteps.



Francis Joseph Handley (1945-2010) aka "Buzzer", Born in Salford, attended De La Salle College, Salford, then Hopwood Hall and Simms, and played rugby at both colleges. Taught at St. Peters and Holy Cross in Bury, before returning to his 'Alma Mater' in Salford. Played Rugby League for Salford and Rugby Union for Manchester. His wife Catrina, and three sons live in Swinton, Manchester.

Robert John Kleinmann (1944-2010) aka "Bob", born in Lancaster, moved to Coventry, attended Ullathorne RCGS, member of C.O.M. at Simms. Taught in London briefly before emigrating to Canada, and spent a teaching career at Notre Dame H.S. Bonneyville, Alberta. Served as volunteer firefighter for 38 years and became Fire Chief and Community Leader. Bob and his wife Gisele died in a car accident three days before Christmas on their way to visit family their family, leaving three children and six grandchildren.



Thomas John McAlliog (1942-1999) Born in Bradford, attended St. Bede's RCGS, worked in the County Court as part of the Home Office Audit Team, before mature entry to Simms. A keen member of the Country Dance Group. He returned to Bradford where he spent a teaching career and became Head of Edmund Campion RC Secondary School. He was married with two children



Terence McCormack (1945-1965) Born in Preston, attended John Southworth RC Secondary School, Preston, where he was Captain of Football, Captain of Preston Schools Football Team and on Preston North End FC books. Completed only one term at Simms, before becoming ill with stomach cancer and died in the New Year. A tragic early loss of life in such an intelligent, fit and healthy young man.



James Raymond Miller (Date-1982) aka "Ray", born in Cleator Moor, Cumberland, attended Cleator Moor College, with National Service in RAF. Worked at Sellafield Nuclear Power Plant before mature entry to Simms. He taught in Cumbria Primary and Residential Schools, and Secondary Schools in London. He was a keen glider pilot and gifted sketch artist, who died in a motor cycle accident while on holiday in France.

Felix Desmond Morris (1945-1969) 'Des' died in a yachting accident at sea.



Douglas Alistair Gordon Pirie (1931-1991) aka "Puff, Puff Pirie", born in Leeds, grew up in Croydon, attended Purley Boys County School. National Service in RAF. Life member of South London Harriers, Coulsdon. Ran in three Olympics, 5,000m Silver Medal in Melbourne 1956, five times World Record holder for 3,000m and 5,000m. BBC Sports Personality of the Year 1955. Ran one sub four minute mile 3.59.9 sec. 1956. Married sprinter Shirley Hampton 1956. Posthumous book 'Running Fast and Injury Free' with John Gilbody, 1996.

John Wade (1945-2009) aka "Jake", born in Bradford, attended St. Bede's RCGS and founder of rugby at a soccer school. A pole vault injury at College ended rugby playing so became fixture secretary of rugby club. He spent a teaching career at St. Mary's R.C. Tech. School in Newcastle upon Tyne, coached Pontieland RUFC, refereed club rugby in Northumberland. His family of wife, Maureen, ex Coloma College, children, Matthew and Rachel and three grandsons, live in Newcastle.
